We are “Living Letters” from Jesus to the World

2 Corinthians 3:3 *“³And you show that you are a letter from Christ . . . ,
written not with ink but with the Spirit of the living God . . .”*

My dear Advent Family, with more than 450 adults, children, and youth from the Southeastern District, Beth and I attended the District Leadership Conference (“Tending the Flame”) on July 30 - Aug 1, 2010 in Richmond, Va. The theme of the conference was “Living Letters” (being the letters of Christ in a world seeking hope and good news) based on the conference theme verses 2 Corinthians 3: 1-3.

We each attended different workshops from the 46 that were offered, covering the topics of prayer, witnessing, mission planting, faith sharing, evangelism and discipleship. “Great Stuff” to bring back and implement in ministry. We also made many good contacts in the district for “networking” in ministry.

The Youth program featured the band Echelon (who was one of the groups at this summer’s Youth Gathering in New Orleans), and the children’s ministry included Sunday school - type activities.

The Sunday morning prayer breakfast speaker was missionary Jonathan Blanke who teaches at the Japan Lutheran Seminary. Those of you who attended our Adult Bible Study on missions will remember the PowerPoint presentation we had from him describing the work he and his family are doing in Japan.

Sunday morning worship with communion was led by Pastor David Guelzow, (Sr Pastor of St. Stephens in Hickory, NC who also served as the conference chaplain) and the praise Band/Team from St. Stephens. President Jon Diefenthaler delivered the sermon titled “Living Letters”.

The Keynote Speaker for the conference was Reggie McNeal (Pastor and National Consultant, whose latest book is titled **“Missional Renaissance: Changing the scorecard for the Church”**). He presented three Plenary Sessions, which covered the topics: “What is The Missional Church, anyway?”, “Holy Spirit Writing - How Do We Get in On It?” and “Tablets of Hearts - What’s the New Scorecard?”

I have several pages of notes, but his main points were: rather than trying to figure out how to “do church” better, Jesus wants us to “be the church” in our community and the world. Missional churches don’t just invite people to church, they bring the church to them by serving.

For the Holy Spirit to write letters through us, 3 shifts need to happen in the way churches operate. We are to shift from an internal to an external (missional) focus; shift from being “program centered” to “people centered”, with the goal of “people growth”; and from a management style of “institutional management” to one of “leading a movement” (Eph 4 church).

His third point on “the new scorecard” encourages us to look at our whole lives as a “Mission Trip”, not just celebrating “church jobs”, but what we do in our whole lives, and “release us all to be ‘people of blessings’ in the community.”

The Advent Church Council has briefly discussed these suggestions, and will implement them as they make sense.

The Theme of next year’s Leadership Conference will address family and multi-generational mission and outreach opportunities. Speakers will include Mary Manz Simon (Nationally known parenting specialist), Joel Dietrich (Director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry - Tacoma Wa.), Victor Belton (LCMS Pastor from Decatur, Ga. who helped start a ministry in Sudan), Marilyn Sharpe (Edina Minn., Book - For Heaven Sake - Parenting Pre-schoolers faithfully), and Dien Taylor (LCMS Pastor from the Bronx who led Bible Studies at this summer’s Youth Gathering in NO). Echelon will also be back to work with the youth and the Child Ministry team will return.

It would be great to get a “contingent from Advent” to go next year!! Some churches bring van and bus loads full of their members to learn, grow, and become better equipped so that God can do the work He intends to do through them. The dates are July 29-31, 2011 in Richmond. Think and pray about it... More later.

Board of Outreach

The Board of Outreach would like to give a big THANK YOU to Anona Serpas for her years of leadership as the chair of the Board of Outreach. She will continue to work with several outreach initiatives. We are also looking for others who would be interested in serving on outreach projects and/or the board.

Over the next couple of months, we will be talking with you about your ideas for outreach. Where do you think the Lord is leading Advent's outreach efforts? All ideas and suggestions would be appreciated. One outreach area under consideration is the houses and apartments that surround Advent. Based on the last demographic survey (2007), we have 42,012 families living within a 5-mile radius of Advent. The area Religious Survey indicated that 45% of the households in the area are not members of any place of worship "such as a church, synagogue, temple, etc." and are therefore considered "un-churched". That is nearly 19,000 households. Is God calling us to reach out to this "mission field" in our own backyard? We also would like to know what outreach and/or volunteer work the congregation is currently performing. We would like to compile this information and use it to allow others to join in on the on-going volunteer work of the congregation. It would also be an excellent witness to our visitors as to Advent's outreach efforts in the local community.

"Dinners for Eight"

Ever wish you had more opportunity to get to know new faces at Advent and spend time with them, as well as some old friends? The Fellowship Committee will be organizing "Dinners for Eight," a small group dinner party providing fellowship with other Advent members. Here's how it works:

- During the month of September, there will be a sign-up sheet in the church narthex for those wishing to participate in "Dinners for Eight."
- After the sign-up is completed, couples and/or singles will be put into groups with a total of about eight people.
- Once the groups are formed, the facilitator will notify one of the couples on the list who will be the first host couple and pass along the contact information for the rest of their group.
- The host couple will then call the other members of the group to set up a dinner date.
- The plan is flexible. The host couple may invite the others in the group to their home, to the church, or to a restaurant. The host couple may furnish the main dish and then coordinate with the others to bring side dishes, bread, desserts, etc. It's up to the group to decide.
- The position of host couple rotates every month until every couple or pair of singles has hosted a dinner.

Men's Retreat

The Men of Advent have scheduled their annual retreat at the Trinity Center from October 15-17, 2010. The Trinity Center is located in Salter Path, NC near Morehead City. All meals are included starting with dinner Friday night and ending with lunch on Sunday.

The retreat not only gives us time for great fellowship, but also provides an opportunity to study the Scriptures together. Pastor Seaman has agreed to lead the Bible Study and discussion on "Discipleship." This topic will be helpful to us all in understanding God's direction for us at Advent, as well as in our personal lives. We have reserved 10 rooms, which holds up to 20 men double occupancy. We currently have 13 confirmed and 3 likely attendees; therefore, we have room for more and can request additional rooms if needed! Please let John Stow or Dave Neely know if you can attend. Care Ministry

Advent's Care Ministry committee met on July 21 and furthered plans to establish a prayer ministry and a card ministry, coordinate caring visits and telephone calls, establish guidelines for providing food/meals when needed, and prepare a budget request to be presented to Council.
