Stewardship in Review - It's <u>Not</u> Just About Money

My Dear Friends in Christ, we just completed a 3-week series focused on Stewardship that showed us that "Stewardship is <u>NOT</u> Just about money!" A Steward is someone who has been put in charge of something by its owner. In scripture, God tells us that He has put us in charge of <u>everything</u> on earth: including our time, talents and treasures. Out of love for all that Jesus has done for us, our <u>life</u> of stewardship is demonstrated by how we <u>use everything</u> God has given us to Glorify Him, and for the good of others.

Our theme for the series was "GROWING AS STEWARDS THROUGH FAITH, LOVE AND HOPE!" And our theme verse was 1 Thessalonians 1:2-3 "We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ." That encompasses much more than just money.

On October 23, we looked at Hebrews 12: 1-2 and saw that we "GROW AS STEWARDS THROUGH <u>FAITH</u>" as we: remember the "cloud of witnesses" (the saints who have gone before us), and follow their example of faith, laying aside the weight and sin which clings so closely to us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the Founder and Perfecter of our faith.

On October 30, we looked at 1 Corinthians 10: 31 and saw that we "GROW AS STEWARDS THROUGH <u>LOVE</u>!" when God's love in Christ prompts us to do something, and we "do it all to the glory of God," even when our life's circumstances are challenging, and other people tell us that what we're doing is unusual or even irrational. Because when we do that, we have the opportunity to experience God working through us to minister to others.

On November 6, we saw that we "GROW AS STEWARDS THROUGH <u>HOPE</u>!" when hope is a "confident expectation based on the solid promises of God" fulfilled in Jesus' life, death and resurrection. This God-given hope moves us to live our whole life in faithfulness towards Him and in fruitful <u>actions</u> toward others.

Our use of the money we have is <u>one</u> example of our Stewardship, but using <u>everything</u> we have for the Glory of God and the Good of others goes way beyond just how we use our money. It's about how we use our <u>life</u>.

In today's difficult economy, you may not be able to give as much <u>money</u> as you'd like to the work of the Lord, but don't let that stop your <u>Stewardship</u>. The Lord looks at our hearts. And in Matthew 25: 35-36, he acknowledges good Stewardship when he says "I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you clothed me, I was sick and you visited me, I was in prison and you came to me." Those acts of kindness demonstrate good Stewardship.

And, one day, you may be pleasantly surprised to discover that God has done abundantly more than you could have ever imagined, with your acts of kindness done in Jesus' Name.

Thank you for your <u>life</u> of good Stewardship!

Thank you to all who returned commitment cards upon completion of "Grow as Stewards through Faith, Love and Hope!" At this point, members and friends have committed \$115,644.00, which is approximately \$12,000.00 less than last year. The response from the Congregation has been outstanding and very heart warming. Thrivent also provided financial support for these meals. Listed below is some additional information about the families who received Thanksgiving meals.

- 1. Family of five Parents, 4th grade girl, kindergarten boy, and new infant. Spanish speaking family, daughter speaks English.
- 2. Family of two Mother and 9-year-old adopted daughter.
- 3. Family of four Parents and two children from Aretia,-Northern Africa. Both children have diabetes and they can never have enough \$ to entertain, requested extra food is to allow them to invite the mother's sister and family. Wanted a traditional American Thanksgiving!!
- 4. **Family of five** English-speaking Burmese refugee family: Parents, 11-year-old girl, 1st grade boy, and 3-year-old boy.

Helping Those in Need: The Fishers are also leading an outreach group exploring ways the congregation can get involved in actively supporting those in the community. The group is looking into food collection options and methods of distribution. We are considering the Back Pack Program and supporting one family each month with a meal (similar to the Thanksgiving meal). We are planning to launch this new initiative in 2012. Sharing the Gospel Message Clearly

It's a big moment. You know God has ordained this moment -- that you would sit in this very seat, next to this very person, at this exact time. As they pour out to you what their family is experiencing and the hopelessness they feel, like a drain that's unclogging, it is undeniable that you have been purposefully placed.

At first you thought to yourself: *I can't believe this person is bearing their soul to me! How did I get into this conversation?* But now, the light bulb goes on in your heart! You have no doubt: *This is a Holy-Spirit appointment.* As someone who has been in this situation several times, I assure you, this is no coincidence.

I too am amazed by the extent a total stranger will open up to me at times. I think to myself: I'm not a counselor. I'm not an exceptionally good listener. I didn't spur this conversation on; and, oddly, this person doesn't seem this open usually. It just... happened! Why? It is a mission moment.

Annoyingly, your head and emotions begin to chime in, as if their opinions are valid in spiritual matters. Your head gives numerous reasons why this could not *possibly* be a spiritual appointment, saying: You just happened to make eye contact and smile at the wrong person at the wrong time.

Your emotions chime in with a shaking voice, full of insecurity: You have nothing to offer this person. You have nothing this person needs. You will just mess up the words, like you always do. Please don't embarrass me!

But, the Holy Spirit continues to prompt you, reminding you of the truth - that you are God's child; you have the power of His Spirit with you - the Spirit of the living God!

With a prayer, blocking out your mind and your emotions, you choose to be led by the Spirit and follow thru on what has been set in your heart. On your own, you have nothing to offer. On your own, you have no words to say. But, you are not on your own. This is a divine appointment.

You know you have the hope found in Christ to share with this heartbroken person. You must speak; and you know it. The motivation and the will are there. Now what? How do you communicate the most important message that could ever utter from your lips with time constraints? Read *Tips for Sharing* below to find out.

WITNESSING

- 1. Listen. Allow them to share their burden with you.
- 2. Connect. Share a time you experienced a similar burden in your personal life.
- 3. **Introduce Christ.** Share that God came through for you at this time and how. He provided His peace and/or His love, displayed through others.
- 4. **Explain sin**... "I don't deserve His help. I mess up all the time." Giving examples... "I have hurt others in the same way this person has hurt me." Help them identify their own sin... "Do you know what I mean?"
- 5. **Explain atonement.** The Bible says that the wages of sin are death. God is just. Sin is a debt that must be paid.
- 6. **Describe God's love.** "He sent His sinless son for us to take on the blame for our sin. Christ paid off our debts. We no longer have to pay the debt ourselves."
- 7. Explain how. "It is a gift to be received -- not something you can buy with goodness."
- 8. **Invite them.** "This help, provision and peace aren't just for me. You can have this too! He loves you just as much as He loves me. You can be in heaven with a loving God for eternity, and enjoy His peace, provision and help in this life... in this situation."

What next? Pray with them. Lead them to the Bible to nurture their relationship with Christ. Invite them to become connected to your body of believers.

Dear Heavenly Father, Thank you for being awesome in our lives. Thank you for taking on that huge debt of sin that once weighed us down so heavily. Sometimes we pick up that load again and try carrying it ourselves, too ashamed to talk to you and hand it over. But you know what we're carrying. You know it's too heavy for us. You already took care of it, knowing well before what would trip us up. We thank you that Christ died for that very sin. We thank you that He carried the cross so we could let go of that load. And thank you for your daily reminders and your loving kindness, telling us daily to put that down. Help us lay this down at your feet every day, always. And, help us to clearly communicate this message to others, weighed down by sin, that they too might be able to walk free and light. In Jesus' Name we pray, Amen.
