Focus for Lent

The Lord's Prayer: A Prayer for All Seasons (Matthew 6: 5-15)

My Dear Friends in Christ, we pray the Lord's Prayer every time we gather for worship. Children learn it at an early age. And it's prayed at the bedside of the ill and the dying. I'm always amazed how people who don't seem to remember much of anything else, can pray the Lord's prayer from memory.

Do you ever pray the Lord's Prayer at any time other than in worship? If not, then I'd like to encourage us all to do something during Lent. Try to pray it at least three times a day, as a discipline, kind of a ritual, if you will.

By doing this, the grace of Jesus, as expressed in this prayer, will become more a part of our everyday life and lifestyle and will be an antidote and a blessing for whatever is going on in our lives. Whether it is pain, guilt, humility, arrogance, needs of any kind, or relationships. The Lord's Prayer is "A Prayer for All Seasons," no matter in what season of life we find ourselves. So, our theme this year for the Wednesdays in Lent is: "The Lord's Prayer: A Prayer for All Seasons."

The more we pray it, the more we begin to interject our own personal needs or thoughts or fears into the prayer. For instance, when we pray "Thy kingdom come," we will begin to say, "And that includes Thy Kingdom come for my neighbors and my enemies as well." And when we pray, "Thy will be done on earth," we will begin to include a prayer for God's will to be done in the lives of our friends, family, and acquaintances for whom we pray on a daily basis.

Each successive week of these Lenten midweeks, we'll focus on one petition of the Lord's Prayer and also include Luther's wonderfully insightful explanation, as follows:

Ash Wednesday (2/10/16):	"Seasons of Needing Forgiveness" – 5 th Petition
Mid-Week Lent 2 (2/17/16):	"Seasons of Lifting Up the Lord" – 1 st Petition
Mid-Week Lent 3 (2/24/16):	"Seasons of Wondering Who's in Control" – 2 nd Petition
Mid-Week Lent 4 (3/2/16):	"Seasons of Seeking God's Will – 3 rd Petition
Mid-Week Lent 5 (3/9/16):	"Seasons of Thanks for Simple Things – 4 th Petition
Mid-Week Lent 6 (3/16/16):	"Seasons for Standing Up to Evil – 6 th & 7 th Petition

Plan now to join your Advent Family for these Mid-Week Services, as well as Holy Week (Maundy Thursday and Good Friday) and Easter.

Our Mid-Week services are at 7:00 p.m. following a light supper at 6:15 p.m. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services are at 7:00 p.m., and our Easter Sunday Celebration begins with an Easter Brunch at 9:15 a.m., followed by Divine Worship with Holy Communion at 10:30 a.m. and an Egg Hunt for the kids following worship.

May the Blessings of Lent and Easter be especially meaningful to you this year.

We are saved by faith alone, but the faith that saves us is never alone. That is because faith is a living, busy, and active thing. It inhales all of God's riches in Christ and exhales this in love and service to the neighbor.

But who is my neighbor? God in His mercy has placed us into three distinct communities: society, family, and the church. That means we have a duty to those around us in each of these communities. We pray for the people in these three communities daily. We rejoice with them in times of joy and suffer with them in times of sadness. And we give to them from the income that God provides as we are able and as they have need.

So we pay taxes to our governments so that they may do the work that is needed for our neighbors in society. We give to our families so that they have food and clothing, house and home, even educations. And we give to our church—our local congregations—so that the gospel may be preached and the sacraments administered for us and others.

The beauty of this is that God smiles upon all that giving. When you pay your taxes, God is pleased that you have served your neighbor who needs what the government provides. When you provide for your family, God is pleased. That you have helped your neighbor with the necessities of life by sharing with them what He has given to you, God is pleased. And when you give to your local congregation to support the ongoing preaching of the gospel, God is pleased. To all this giving, He says to you, "Well done, my good and faithful servant."

Looking at giving in this light makes it a joy to give. The joy is multiplied. There is joy in you because you have served your neighbor in his need. There is joy in your neighbor for God has answered their prayers through you. And God rejoices and is pleased with it all. It might just make the humdrum of grocery shopping and mortgage payments a bit more joyous. It might even make April 15 tolerable (St. Paul had to have this pep talk with the Romans, also, "This is why you pay taxes...." Rom. 13:6). And it surely will make the envelope placed into the offering plate a joyful thing.

Indeed, God is pleased with you. You are saved by faith alone because of Jesus Christ. And that saving faith is never alone. It is busy and active. It serves the neighbor in society, family, and church with free and cheerful giving.

Results of November 2015 Stewardship Focus for the 2016 Budget

Income vs. Expense

The November focus on stewardship resulted in 30 pledge cards being returned for a total of \$152,079.00 and represents an increase of more than \$6200 over last year's amount pledged - 11 of the 30 are an increase over the previous year's amount. In calculating Advent's 2016 income for budget purposes, I have again used the cards returned, estimated offerings of those who give but do not return a pledge card, loose plate giving, donations from Thrivent members through the Thrivent Choice program, and other income such as building rental, rebates, etc. The total estimated 2016 income is \$165,860. Thank you to all who continue to support the ministry of Advent Lutheran Church. We appreciate you.
