Experiencing Jesus on your Summer Vacation

My Dear Friends in Christ, when you are able to get away for a summer vacation, whether it's to the beach, to Disneyworld, to Branson, on a cruise, or maybe just a "staycation" at home, do you include experiencing Jesus in your list of expectations for your time off?

I've found that many times the change in routine that comes with vacation time can also mean changing my routine of morning Bible study, prayer and meditating on God as well.

As I am writing this, Beth and I are enjoying a week at the beach at Emerald Isle, NC. I have found that doing my morning Bible study while hearing and looking at the waves crashing in on the shore, puts an enhanced perspective on God and His creation.

One of the things that we like to do is to sit in our beach chairs under an umbrella reading a good book and taking the occasional walk down the shore to collect sea shells. One of the ways that God impresses on me the wonder of His creation is in the vastness of the ocean and in the variety and intricacy of the seashells He creates.

This week I read two books that I found very enriching and encouraging. I recommend them both. One was by Timothy Keller, titled, "The Reason for God", subtitled: "Belief in an Age of Skepticism". It's a great book to recommend to anyone who is struggling with accepting the Christian faith. It is a little heavy reading, but well worth it.

The second book is lighter in nature, written by one of my favorite authors, Max Lucado and titled: "Fearless" and subtitled: "Imagine Your Life without Fear". One of the chapters talks about finding Jesus where you don't expect to find Him. The chapter was titled: "I'm Sinking Fast", subtitled: "Fear of Overwhelming Challenges".

In this chapter, Max talks about how we can find Jesus in the midst of the storms of our lives such as: in the midst of a divorce, being tossed about by guilt; in the midst of debt, being tossed about by creditors; in the midst of a recession; being tossed about by stimulus packages and bailouts; and, I would add, in the midst of a crisis with a friend or family member, being tossed about by the possibility of losing the relationship or worse.

Max relates this to the disciples finding Jesus in the midst of the storm on the Sea of Galilee, while they were being tossed about by the wind and the waves. They didn't expect Jesus to come to them at that time and in the way He did (walking on the water). So, Max encourages us to watch expectantly for Jesus in the midst of storms in a way that we would least expect to see Him.

That's all true, but I have found this week that Jesus also "showed up" in the quiet relaxing moments in ways that I least expected Him to. Remember His promise in Matthew 28: 20, "I am with you always, to the end of the age." Look for Jesus on your vacation this summer, He will be there, and you will find Him!

May the Peace of God that passes all understanding keep your hearts and minds at rest as you trust in Christ Jesus... Pastor John.
