Speaking of missions and outreach, one of the greatest needs in the surrounding counties is food! The Food Bank of Eastern and Central NC has several major programs which support the distribution of food to those in need including: Fresh Produce Program, Mobile Food Pantry, Retail Recovery Program, Salvage Program, Kids Café Program, and Bayer Cropscience Backpack Program

The food bank distributes tons of food to the various food pantries in Eastern and Central NC. For instance, John and Cathy Stow collect food from the food bank for the CORA Pantry. John provided the following information. "We pick food up from the Durham Food Bank (one-two times a month; normally 200+ pounds of bread, 300+ lbs of meat and 150 lbs of canned goods) and take it to CORA (Chatham County Food Pantry in Pittsboro) where it gets distributed. CORA fed 395 families and 1331 individuals in July. They take food donations from families and local grocery stores besides buying food themselves. They will obviously also take cash donations and people can volunteer to help distribute the food and stock it as well."

All of the pantry programs are under great pressure to provide food to those in need. The <u>Backpack program</u> supports the nutritional needs of children during non-school hours, specifically weekends. It targets children who would benefit from nutritious meals. Once each week, the kids are given a special backpack filled with non-perishable food that can be used to meet their weekend nutritional needs. Reports say these backpacks are the only food some of these kids get on the weekend!

This fall we will be offering opportunities and information on how we can assist these programs by donating food, money and our time to support those who are need of food. By helping these food programs and the people they support we are meeting one of the most basic human needs-FOOD!

As John the Baptist stated in Luke 3:8-11, "Produce fruit in keeping with repentance. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham. ⁹The ax is already at the root of the trees, and every tree that does not produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown into the fire." ¹⁰"What should we do then?" the crowd asked. ¹¹John answered, "Anyone who has two shirts should share with the one who has none, and anyone who has food should do the same."

Evangelism

The Men's Bible Study is watching a video on the book of Matthew. As we watch this video, we can clearly see that Jesus took the good news to the people and met their needs where they were. Evangelism comes from the words "euagelion" (good news, gospel) and "euangelizomai" (to proclaim good news). I would think our evangelism efforts should follow that of Jesus and the 1st century disciples. Rev. Roosevelt Gray, Jr. states, "We should engage people were we find them, sharing with them God's means of grace and identifying with them according to their needs." As Rev Gray suggests, there are no magical tools that make evangelism effective. But whatever method we follow, we must stay focused on who Jesus is and what He did for us.

Final thought—I think most of know in our heart what we need to do to share the good news—we just need to get past our fear and let God lead us.
